

Together, Berlin and Brandenburg form a large economic area — The German Capital Region.




Size, in km²



Innovation with a future

Just one of many examples of electromobility: The "Charging Node", developed in Wildau, makes it possible to charge up for a range of 200 km in just 10 minutes, regardless of any existing infrastructure. CO2-neutral power is generated from liquid, renewable energy storage at the charging station itself.





Change in real GVA 2019-2030, in %


















The region of renewable energy

Brandenburg is Germany's front runner when it comes to renewable energies. The state has the highest installed per-capita output in the whole of Germany.




The region of renewable energy

International investors in Brandenburg

The world loves to do business in Brandenburg — this is clear from the great many international relocation and investment projects.



Exports from Brandenburg I

Almost one in three euros of Brandenburg's manufacturing sector is now earned on the global markets.

From 2010 to 2020 the share of foreign revenue in Brandenburg increased by 2.3% **29.5**%.

88.8 % almost all of Brandenburg's export goods are industrial products.

This includes ready-made products at 89 %, of which 67 % are end products.





In 2019 pharmaceutical products with a goods value of close to

EUR 1.2 billion (9.4% of total exports)

and aircraft with a goods value of close to

EUR 1.2 billion (9.3 % der Gesamtausfuhr)

were the most important subgroup goods in the state's exports.



Goods export to destination continents and country groups in EUR thousands



Development of real gross domestic product 2020

Rate of change of gross domestic product, in % (in real terms, chained)



While Brandenburg's economic performance dropped overall in 2020 in the wake of the coronavirus pandemic, it still dropped less than in the German economy as a whole: the national **change rate of the gross domestic product in real terms** (GDP) decreased two years ago by 4.9 %. In Brandenburg the downturn was only -3.2 %.

This means that **economic growth** in Brandenburg was at 0.5 % over the past five years, thus slightly above the national average of 0.4 %. The domestic economy has been the economic driving force in the past few years.
